- **Coordination Committee:** Arianna Becerril García (REDALYC/AmeliCA), Laetitia Bracco (Université de Lorraine), Andrea Davidson & Vanessa Proudman (SPARC Europe), Ana Persic & Rania Sabo (UNESCO) - oversees overall day-to-day OSMI operations
- **Governance** to be discussed this year.

Participants

- 51 confirmed members as of 25 Feb 2025
- Africa: 5 / Asia: 3 / Central/South America: 1 / Europe: 35 / North America: 6 / Oceania: 1 → we should all make sure all regions are heard!
- Affiliations: 30 at university and/or research institution; but also representation of libraries, funders, private sector, national organizations, IGOs, and NGOs
- Stakeholder groups: 14 OS policy makers, 8 Representing institutions interested in serving OSMI, 5 Content providers; out of remaining 24, 18 are researchers
- Of course many of us have multiple roles!
